General Instructions

Abstracts for Oral and Poster Presentations must be submitted in advance in the format described below. Abstracts will be published for the Conference delegates as a Book of Abstracts.

Authors will be required to register for the Conference.

Please be sure that you have obtained any necessary permissions from your organization before submitting an Abstract. Academic authors are cautioned against including pre-publication information in Abstracts. All authors should be careful not to disclose information which may be the basis of a patent application.

Delegates at the Conference usually like to obtain copies of speakers' slides; we can make them available to delegates through the Conference website after the Conference. Some speakers prefer not to distribute their slides: if that is your preference, please let us know. A compromise is to allow distribution of an edited version of the presentation.

After the Conference we will prepare and publish widely through social media a slide presentation on the Conference, which will include one slide for each presenter, with their picture (see the slide presentation for [Sensors in Medicine 2014](#)). You can prepare your own summary slide, or we can do it for you.

PLEASE SPELL CHECK YOUR ABSTRACT

Abstract Format

Abstracts should be in Microsoft Word format (**NOT** pdf) A4 size

Oral presentation abstracts should be limited to 200 words

Poster presentation abstracts should be limited to 100 words

The font used should be Calibri

Diagrams and illustrations should not be included

Title	14 pt Bold - Capital and lower case for each word, except “the”, “and” etc
Author(s)	12 pt - Presenting author Bold; other authors Regular
Affiliation and address	11pt Regular, Capitals and lower case for each word. Use vertical stroke “ ” as separator not commas
Multiple author and affiliations	Use superscript “ ¹ ”, “ ² ” etc to designate affiliation for each author
Text	11 pt Regular - insert one 11pt space above text
References	10 pt Regular; limited to four; use “ ¹ ”, “ ² ” etc for each reference; do not include the subtitle “References”
Additional information e.g. Acknowledgements	10 pt Italic

Separate each section of the Abstract with 6pt (2mm)
